Don't Forget!

Test your smoke alarms **once a month** and **change the batteries** at least **once a year**.



Auto theft numbers in Charles County are on the rise!! To minimize your chances of becoming a victim, we recommend the following:

- Park your vehicle in a well lit and secure area when in public/at home, park in a garage if possible.
- Ensure valuables are moved out of eyesight inside your vehicle.
- Manually check if your car is locked via the door handle before walking away. Signal jamming (by thieves), may cause your key fob not to lock your vehicle.
- Add theft deterrents to your vehicle, The Club and Disklok steering wheel locks, aftermarket alarm systems.
- Get anti-theft software/upgrades installed from your vehicle dealership.

Consider registering your vehicle in the "Watch Your Car" program, sponsored by the Maryland Vehicle Theft Prevention Council. Vehicle owners sign an application stating their vehicle is not normally used between the hours of 1:00am and 5:00am. The owners are given special decals, which are placed on the front and back windows of their vehicle. Once registered, this gives law enforcement officers permission to stop your vehicle between the hours of 1:00am and 5:00am to verify that the driver is actually the owner of the vehicle or an authorized driver. for more information on the "Watch Your Car" program, please call 1-800-96-THEFT or email the Maryland Vehicle Theft Prevention Council at msp.vtpc@maryland.gov.
