Shining a Light on Human Trafficking: Awareness and Action

Each year, on July 30, the United Nations recognizes **World Day Against Trafficking in Persons**, a global call to raise awareness about one of the fastest-growing crimes impacting communities across the world, including right here in Maryland. Human trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery that exploits people for sex or labor through force, fraud, or coercion. According to the latest statistics from the National Human Trafficking Hotline, Maryland reported **368 human trafficking cases in 2023**, and many of these victims were children and teenagers.

Although it can seem like a hidden crisis, it is happening in every state and every type of community. The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children estimates that 1 in 6 endangered runaways reported in 2023 were likely victims of sex trafficking, and the average age of a child first targeted is just 12–14 years old. Traffickers often target vulnerable individuals — especially young people — online, in neighborhoods, and even in schools. The good news is that with increased awareness and education, we can recognize the warning signs and help prevent exploitation.

What can you do?

- **Learn the signs.** Be alert for sudden changes in behavior, signs of fear, unexplained injuries, or restricted freedom of movement.

- Trust your instincts. If something doesn't seem right, speak up.
- **Report suspicions**. If the person is not in immediate danger, call the **National Human Trafficking Hotline at 1-888-373-7888**. If the person is in imminent danger, call **911** right away.
- **Share the knowledge.** Talk openly with friends, family, and peers about this issue. Education is a powerful tool for prevention.
