

Energy Efficiency Programs

Making sure your property is energy efficient will provide savings on your utility bills. The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development offers programs that provide homeowners of all income levels; with the resources to improve their home's energy efficiency.

EmPOWER Limited Income Energy Efficiency Program (LIEEP)

Repairs and upgrades to a home can significantly reduce energy use throughout the year, which can give you a more comfortable home, lower power bills and improve air quality and family health. Maryland's EmPOWER Programs help limited income households with installation of materials and equipment at no charge. The EmPOWER Programs include:

- Energy Kits
- Base Efficiency
- Whole Home Efficiency
- Maryland Energy Efficiency Tune-Up (MEET)
- Multifamily Energy Efficiency and Housing Affordability (MEEHA)

Maryland Energy Assistance Program (MEAP)

MEAP is a federally funded program available to assist eligible households in Maryland with their non-functioning heating, cooling, and water heating systems.

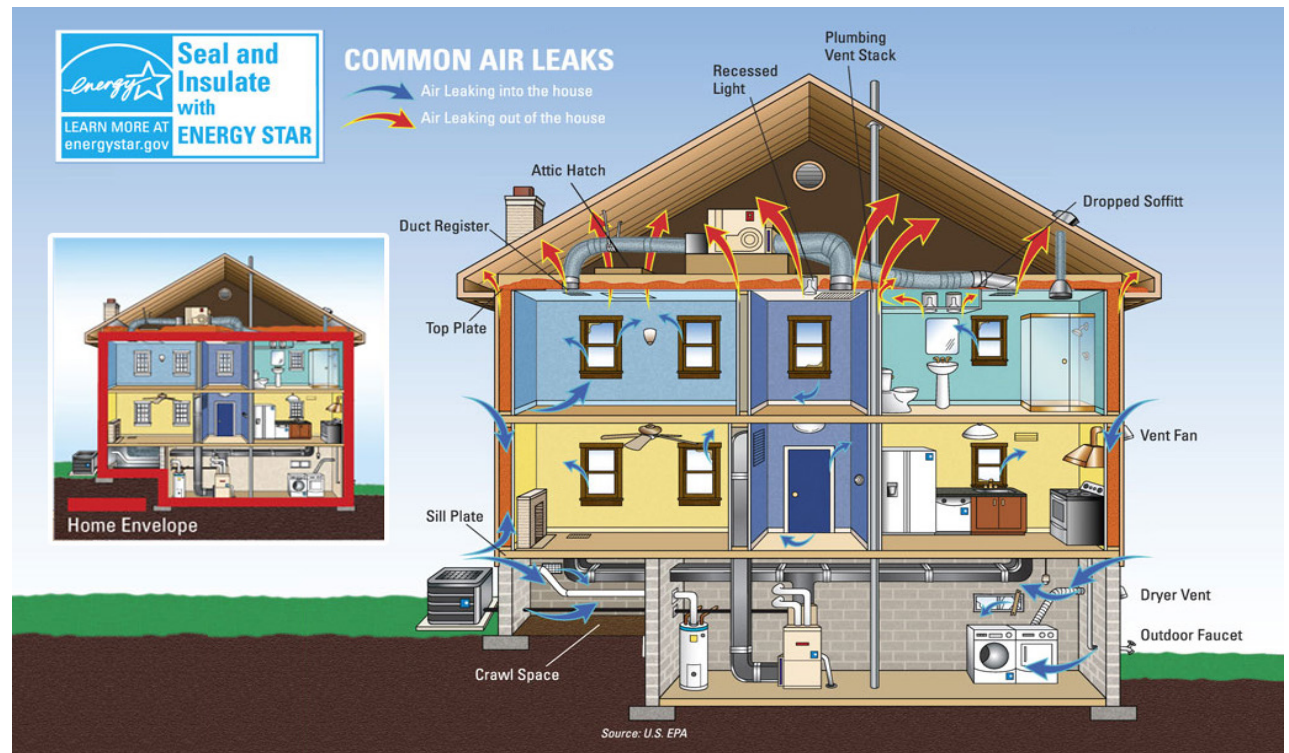
BeSMART Loan

The BeSMART Home Energy Loan Program provides financing to reduce your energy bill and increase comfort. Loans are offered at 6.99% APR for 10 years for homeowners with qualifying credit (≥ 640) and verified income. Eligible

measures include HVAC, insulation, ENERGY STAR appliances and more.

Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP)

The Department of Energy's (DOE) Weatherization Assistance Program is the oldest and largest residential energy conservation program in the country. Maryland's WAP provides services across the entire State of Maryland. The WAP reduces energy costs for low-income households by increasing the energy efficiency of their homes, while ensuring health and safety.
